Discovered during the 1920s the Aurignacian open-air site of Breitenbach produced thousands of artefacts and faunal remains.

Through geological coring finds were traced over an area of > 10,000 m<sup>2</sup>.

This makes Breitenbach the largest Early Upper Palaeolithic site of Western Eurasia, promising entirely new insights into past settlement organization.
